April 2—***Murder on the Orient Express*** (2017) When a murder occurs on the train he's travelling on, celebrated detective Hercule Poirot is recruited to solve the case. Starring Kenneth Branagh, Penelope Cruz, and Judy Dench. Rated PG-13, 1 hour, 54 min.

April 9—***Defiance*** (2008) Starring Daniel Craig and Liev Schreiber. Jewish brothers in Nazi-occupied Eastern Europe escape into the Belarussian forests, where they join Russian resistance fighters, and endeavor to build a village, in order to protect themselves and about one thousand Jewish non-combatants. Rated R; 2 hours, 17 min. **Discussion to follow led by Linda Dubin.**

April 16—***Whiplash*** (2014) Starring Miles Teller and J.K. Simmons. Andrew Neiman is an ambitious young jazz drummer, single-minded in his pursuit to rise to the top of his elite east coast music conservatory. Plagued by the failed writing career of his father, Andrew hungers day and night to become one of the greats. Terence Fletcher, an instructor equally known for his teaching talents as for his terrifying methods, leads the top jazz ensemble in the school. Fletcher discovers Andrew and transfers the aspiring drummer into his band, forever changing the young man's life. Andrew's passion to achieve perfection quickly spirals into obsession, as his ruthless teacher continues to push him to the brink of both his ability – and his sanity. Rated R; 1 hour, 47 min. **Discussion and refreshments to follow.**

April 23—***The Shape of Water*** (2017) Starring Sally Hawkins and Octavia Spencer. At a top secret research facility in the 1960s, a lonely janitor forms a unique relationship with an amphibious creature that is being held in captivity. Rated R; 2 hours. Academy Award Winner for Best Picture 2018.

April 30—***Three Billboards Outside Ebbing, Missouri*** (2017) Starring Frances McDormand and Woody Harrelson. A mother personally challenges the local authorities to solve her daughter's murder when they fail to catch the culprit. Rated R; 1 hour; 55 min.

May 7—***Breathe*** (2017) Starring Claire Foy and Andy Garfield. Breathe brings to life the inspiring true love story between Robin and Diana Cavendish, an adventurous couple who refuse to give up in the face of devastating odds. PG-13; 1 hour, 58 min.

May 14—***The Phantom Thread*** (2017) Starring Daniel Day Lewis and Vicky Krieps. Set in 1950's London, Reynolds Woodcock is a renowned dressmaker whose fastidious life is disrupted by a young, strong-willed woman, Alma, who becomes his muse and lover. Rated R; 2 hours; 10 min.

May 21—***Battle of the Sexes*** (2017) Starring Emma Stone and Steve Carrell. The true story of the 1973 tennis match between World number one Billie Jean King and ex-champ and serial hustler Bobby Riggs. **Discussion and refreshments to follow**

June 4—***The Post*** (2017) Starring Meryl Streep and Tom Hanks. A cover-up that spanned four U.S. Presidents pushed the country's first female newspaper publisher and a hard-driving editor to join an unprecedented battle between the press and the government. Rated PG-13; 1 hour; 57 min.

June 11—***Darkest Hour*** (2017) Starring Gary Oldman and Lily James. During the early days of World War II, the fate of Western Europe hangs on the newly-appointed British Prime Minister Winston Churchill, who must decide whether to negotiate with Adolf Hitler, or fight on against incredible odds. Rated PG-13; 2 hours, 5 min.

June 18—***Victoria & Abdul*** (2017) Starring Judy Dench and Ali Fazal. Queen Victoria strikes up an unlikely friendship with a young Indian clerk named Abdul Karim. Rated PG-13; 1 hour, 47 min. **Discussion and refreshments to follow.**

June 25—***Wonder*** (2017) Starring Jacob Tremblay, Julia Roberts and Owen Wilson. Based on the New York Times bestseller, *WONDER* tells the incredibly inspiring and heartwarming story of August Pullman, a boy with facial differences who enters 5th grade, attending a mainstream elementary school for the first time. Rated PG; 1 hour; 53 min.
