January 2—*The Secret Life of Pets* (2016) Featuring the voice talents of Eric Stonestreet and Louis C.K. What do your pets do when you're not home? When their owners leave for the day, pets from the building gossip with their friends, satisfy their "sweet tooth" and throw outrageous parties. But when a pampered terrier and his unruly new "roommate" from the pound get lost in the urban jungle of New York City, they must put aside their differences to survive the epic journey back home. Rated PG; 87 min.

January 9—*Eddie the Eagle* (2016) Starring Taron Egerton and Hugh Jackman. The story of Eddie Edwards, the notoriously tenacious British underdog ski jumper who charmed the world at the 1988 Winter Olympics. Rated PG-13; 1 hour, 46 min. ***Special discussion and refreshments to follow screening.***

January 16—*45 Years* (2016) Starring Charlotte Rampling and Tom Courtney. A married couple preparing to celebrate their wedding anniversary receives shattering news that promises to forever change the course of their lives. Rated R; 95 min. ***Discussion and refreshments to follow screening.***

January 23—*Ben Hur* (2016) Starring Jack Huston and Morgan Freeman. Judah Ben-Hur, a prince falsely accused of treason by his adopted brother, an officer in the Roman army, returns to his homeland after years at sea to seek revenge, but finds redemption. Rated PG-13; 125 min.

January 30—*Pride & Prejudice* (2005) Starring Keira Knightley and Matthew Macfadyen. The story is based on Jane Austen's novel about five sisters - Jane, Elizabeth, Mary, Kitty and Lydia Bennet - in Georgian England. Their lives are turned upside down when a wealthy young man, Mr. Bingley and his best friend Mr. Darcy, arrive in their neighborhood. Rated PG; 128 min.

February 6—*Sully* (2016) Starring Tom Hanks. The story of Chesley Sullenberger, an American pilot who became a hero after landing his damaged plane on the Hudson River in order to save the flight's passengers and crew. Rated PG-13; 96 min.

February 13—*The Light Between Oceans* (2016) Starring Michael Fassbender and Alicia Vikander. When a lifeboat bearing precious cargo washes ashore, a lighthouse keeper and his wife face a dilemma that will engulf their world, and that of a stranger, in a love story about a fateful choice. Rated PG-13; 133 min.

February 27—*The Meddler* (2015) Starring Susan Sarandon and Rose Byrne. With a new iPhone, an apartment near the Grove, and a comfortable bank account left to her by her beloved late husband, Marnie Minervini has happily relocated from New Jersey to Los Angeles to be near her daughter Lori, a successful but still single screenwriter, and smother her with motherly love. But when the dozens of texts, unexpected visits, and conversations dominated by unsolicited advice force Lori to draw strict personal boundaries, Marnie finds ways to channel her eternal optimism and forceful generosity to change the lives of others - as well as her own - and find a new purpose in life. Rated PG-13; 120 min. *Discussion and refreshments to follow screening.*

March 6—*Persuasion* (2007) Starring Sally Hawkins and Rupert Penry-Jones. Anne Elliot fell deeply in love with the handsome young naval officer Frederick Wentworth at the age of nineteen. But with neither fortune nor rank to recommend him, Anne was persuaded to break off her engagement. Eight years later, Anne has lived to regret her decision. She never stopped loving Wentworth, and when he returns from sea with a fortune and rank, she can only watch as every eligible young woman in the district falls at his feet. Will their second chance at love be ruined by the social conventions that destroyed it once? Or will the heart be persuaded by rules of its own? Not Rated; 93 min.

March 13—*A Shine of Rainbows* (2011) Starring Aidan Quinn and Connie Nielsen. A truly inspiring story of one ordinary family's extraordinary journey. An orphaned boy named Tomás is adopted by Maire O'Donnell to live on a whimsical Irish isle filled with new friends, secret caves and a lost baby pup seal stranded on the coast. But when Maire's reluctant husband Alec refuses to accept Tomás as his own son, the boy drifts down a fateful path of adventure and self-discovery, illuminating how rainbows can shine around--and within--us all. Rated PG; 111 min.

March 20—*Florence Foster Jenkins* (2016) Starring Meryl Street and Hugh Grant. Set in 1940s New York, Florence Foster Jenkins is the true story of the legendary New York heiress and socialite who obsessively pursued her dream of becoming a great singer. The voice she heard in her head was beautiful, but to everyone else it was hilariously awful. Her husband and manager, St. Clair Bayfield, an aristocratic English actor, was determined to protect his beloved Florence from the truth. But when Florence decided to give a public concert at Carnegie Hall, St. Clair knew he faced his greatest challenge. Rated PG-13; 110 min. *Discussion and refreshments to follow screening.*

March 27—*Queen of Katwe* (2016) Starring Lupita Nyong'o and David Oyelowo. A Ugandan girl's life changes forever when she discovers she has an amazing talent for chess in this celebration of the human spirit. Rated PG; 124 min.
