July 2—***Only the Brave*** (2017) Starring Josh Brolin and Jeff Bridges. Based on the true story of the Granite Mountain Hotshots, a group of elite firefighters who risk everything to protect a town from a historic wildfire. Rated PG-13; 2 hours 14 min.

July 9—***Goodbye Christopher Robin*** (2017) Starring Domhnall Gleeson and Margo Robbie. A behind-the-scenes look at the life of author A.A. Milne and the creation of the Winnie the Pooh stories inspired by his son, C.R. Milne. Rated PG; 1 hour 47 min.

July 16—***Lady Bird*** (2017) Starring Saoirse Ronan and Laurie Metcalf. Christine "Lady Bird" McPherson fights against but is exactly like her wildly loving, deeply opinionated and strong-willed mom, a nurse working tirelessly to keep her family afloat after Lady Bird's father loses his job. LADY BIRD is an affecting look at the relationships that shape us, the beliefs that define us, and the unmatched beauty of a place called home. Rated R; 1 hour, 34 min. *Discussion and refreshments to follow.*

July 23—***The Greatest Showman*** (2017) Starring Hugh Jackman and Michelle Williams. Celebrates the birth of show business, and tells of a visionary who rose from nothing to create a spectacle that became a worldwide sensation. Rated PG; 1 hour, 45 min.

July 30—***The Secret Scripture*** (2016) Starring Rooney Mara, Eric Bana and Vanessa Redgrave. Rose McNulty, once a vibrant and lively beauty, has spent the majority of her adult life confined to a mental hospital in Ireland. Institutionalized during the war and kept there for so long, no one seems to remember why Rose was hospitalized in the first place. When new chief psychiatrist Dr. Grene arrives, he takes a keen interest in Rose. He finds a hidden memoir, written over the course of decades by Rose, that unravels the mystery of her wartime love, incarceration, and the tale of her passionate, yet tortured, life. Rated PG-13; 1 hour 48 min.

August 6—***Film Stars Don't Die in Liverpool*** (2017) Starring Annette Benning and Jamie Bell. Real life proves just as dramatic off-screen as it does on it for these two actors, the aging Hollywood superstar Gloria Grahame and her younger lover, Peter Turner. As their mismatched romance waxes and wanes over time, events conspire to keep them in each other's lives even when it proves difficult and demanding. Ultimately, they find that they must each come to terms with whatever fate they face in the future whether they are together or apart. Rated R; 1 hour 45 min.

August 13—**Little Boy** (2015) Starring Emily Watson and Jakob Salvati. In a heartwarming tale of faith, hope, and love, a little boy tries with all his might to achieve the impossible: bring his father home from war. PG-13; 1 hour 46 min.

August 20—**All the Money in the World** (2017) The story of the kidnapping of 16-year-old John Paul Getty III and the desperate attempt by his devoted mother to convince his billionaire grandfather Jean Paul Getty to pay the ransom. Rated R; 2 hours 12 min.

August 27—**I Can Only Imagine** (2018) Starring Dennis Quaid and J. Michael Finley. The inspiring and unknown true story behind MercyMe's beloved, chart topping song that brings ultimate hope to so many is a gripping reminder of the power of true forgiveness. Rated PG; 1 hour 50 min.

September 10—**Of Mice and Men** (1992) Starring Gary Sinise and John Malkovich. Two drifters, one a gentle but slow giant, try to make money working the fields during the Depression so they can fulfill their dreams. Rated PG-13; 1 hour and 55 min. Based on the book by John Steinbeck.

September 17—**Fahrenheit 451** (1966) Starring Julie Christie and Oskar Werner. In an oppressive future, a fireman whose duty is to destroy all books begins to question his task.

September 24—**The Scarlet Letter** (1995) Starring Gary Oldman and Demi Moore. An affair between a young woman and a pastor has disastrous consequences. Rated R; 2 hours 15 min. Based on the book by Nathaniel Hawthorne.
