July 1 - Don't Worry, He Won't Get Far on Foot (2018): After Portland slacker John Callahan nearly loses his life in a car accident, the last thing he intends to do is give up drinking. But when he reluctantly enters treatment - with encouragement from his girlfriend and a charismatic sponsor - Callahan discovers a gift for drawing edgy, irreverent newspaper cartoons that develop a national following and grant him a new lease on life. Based on a true story, this poignant, insightful and often funny drama about the healing power of art is adapted from Callahan's autobiography and directed by two-time Oscar nominee Gus Van Sant. Jack Black, Carrie Brownstein, Beth Ditto and Kim Gordon also star. Rated R. Running time: 1 hour, 54 minutes.

July 8 - Apollo 11 (2019): Apollo 11 was the spaceflight that landed the first two people on the Moon. Commander Neil Armstrong and lunar module pilot Buzz Aldrin, both American, landed the Apollo Lunar Module Eagle on July 20, 1969. In honor of the 50th Anniversary, this documentary presents never-before-seen footage and audio recordings taking you straight into the heart of NASA's most celebrated mission as astronauts Armstrong and Aldrin embark on a historic trip to the moon. Apollo 11 is a cinematic space event film fifty years in the making. Rated G. Running time: 1 hour, 33 minutes.

July 15 - Can You Ever Forgive Me? (2018): Lee Israel made her living in the 1970's and 80's profiling the likes of Katharine Hepburn, Tallulah Bankhead, Estee Lauder and journalist Dorothy Kilgallen. When Lee is no longer able to get published because she has fallen out of step with current tastes, she turns her art form to deception, abetted by her loyal friend Jack. An adaptation of the memoir "Can You Ever Forgive Me?" relays the true story of the best-selling celebrity biographer. Rated R. Running time: 1 hour, 46 minutes. **Discussion and refreshments to follow.**

July 22 - Beautifully Broken (2018): A man named William escapes the Rwandan genocide and is able to come to America as a refugee. He befriends Randy, an American man struggling to connect with his rebellious daughter Andrea. She will only confide in her pen pal, who also happens to be from Rwanda. William travels with Randy and his family to Rwanda and discovers Andrea's friend has a connection to the violence his family experienced during the civil war. Rated PG-13. Running time: 1 hour, 48 minutes.

July 29 - No movie - Musical Performance: *The American Songbook*

August 5 - Mary Queen of Scots (2018): Mary Queen of Scots explores the turbulent life of Mary Stuart. Queen of France at 16 and widowed at 18, Mary defies pressure to remarry. Instead, she returns to her native Scotland to reclaim her rightful throne alongside her cousin Elizabeth I who rules as England's Queen. Rivals in power and in love, and female monarchs in a masculine world, the two must decide how to play the game of marriage versus independence. Determined to rule as much more than a figurehead, Mary asserts her claim to the English throne, threatening Elizabeth's sovereignty. Betrayal, rebellion, and conspiracies within each court imperil both thrones—and change the course of history. Rated R. Running time: 2 hours, 5 minutes.

August 12 - Beautiful Boy (2018): Teenager Nicolas Sheff seems to have it all with good grades and being an actor, artist, athlete and editor of the school newspaper. When Nic's addiction to meth threatens to destroy him, his father does whatever he can to save his son and family. Rated R. Running time: 2 hours.

August 19 - On the Basis of Sex (2018): Ruth Bader Ginsburg is a struggling attorney and new mother who faces adversity and numerous obstacles in her fight for equal rights. When Ruth takes on a groundbreaking tax case with her husband, attorney Martin Ginsburg, she knows it could change the direction of her career and the way the courts view gender discrimination. Rated PG-13. Running time: 2 hours. *Discussion and refreshments to follow.*

August 26 - Dog Days (2018): A group of interconnected people in Los Angeles are brought together by their lovely canine counterparts. Elizabeth is a charming anchorwoman who seeks advice from her dog's therapist. Tara is a spunky barista who dreams of a life beyond the coffee shop. Daisy is a dog walker who's enamoured with a client. Garrett pines for a woman while trying to keep his adopt-a-dog business afloat. The beloved canines in their lives soon start to influence their careers, friendships and romantic relationships in funny and unexpected ways. Rated PG. Running time: 1 hour, 53 minutes.

September 2 - closed Labor Day

September 9 – Vice (2018): Governor George W Bush of Texas picks Dick Cheney the CEO of Halliburton Co, to be his Republican running mate in the 2000 presidential election. No stranger to politics, Cheney's impressive résumé includes stints as White House chief of staff, House Minority Whip and Defense Secretary. When Bush wins by a narrow margin, Cheney begins to use his newfound power to help reshape the country and the world. Rated R. Running time: 2 hours, 13 minutes.

September 16 - Operation Finale (2018): Director Chris Weitz's historical thriller is based on the story of how a group of Israeli secret agents arrested notorious SS officer Adolf Eichmann - the man who masterminded the "Final Solution" - in Argentina. Rated PG-13. Running time: 2 hours, 2 minutes. *Discussion and refreshments to follow.*

September 23 - Welcome to Marwen (2018): When a devastating attack shatters Mark Hogancamp (Steve Carell) and wipes away all memories, no one expected recovery. Putting together pieces from his old and new life, Mark meticulously creates a wondrous town where he can heal and be heroic. As he builds an astonishing art installation—a testament to the most powerful women he knows—through his fantasy world, he draws strength to triumph in the real one. Rated PG-13. Running time: 1 hour, 56 minutes.

September 30 – Shoplifters (2018): On the margins of Tokyo, a dysfunctional band of outsiders is united by fierce loyalty and a penchant for petty theft. When the young son is arrested, secrets are exposed that upend their tenuous, below-the-radar existence. Rated R. Running time: 2 hours, 1 minute. *Please note: this film is in Japanese with English subtitles.*
