*The Beverly Hillbillies* (1962–1971) Buddy Ebsen stars as Jed Clampett and his nouveau riche hillbilly family, who move to Beverly Hills and shake up the privileged society with their hayseed ways.

*Bonanza* (1959-1973) The Wild West adventures of Ben Cartwright (Lorne Greene) and his sons as they run and defend their Nevada ranch while helping the surrounding community.

*Dennis the Menace* (1959-1963) Based on the comic strip character, the show follows the lives of the Mitchell family – Henry, Alice, and their only child, Dennis, an energetic, trouble-prone, mischievous boy.

*The Dick Van Dyke Show* (1961-1966) Dick Van Dyke and Mary Tyler Moore star as Rob and Laura Petrie, a TV writer and housewife, living the dream in suburban New Rochelle. The show follows their misadventures at the office and at home.

*The Donna Reed Show* (1958–1966) The first TV family sitcom to feature the mother as the center of the show. Reed's character, Donna Stone, is a loving mother and wife, but also a strong woman, an active participant in her community, a woman with feelings and a sense of humor.

*The Doris Day Show* (1968–1973) The beloved actress-singer-animal rights leader stars as Doris Martin, a widow raising two young sons. The sitcom series is remembered for its multiple format and cast changes over the course of its five-seasons, all of which are available.

*Family Affair* (1966-1971) Brian Keith stars as bachelor Bill Davis whose seemingly perfect Manhattan life is upended by tragedy - his brother and sister-in-law die unexpectedly, leaving their three children orphaned. Davis takes in the children - and through humorous trial and error, coupled with big doses of love and patience, they become a real family.

*Father Knows Best* (1954-1960) The popular radio show comes to life in this hit sitcom about a wise family man, Jim Anderson (Robert Young) his common-sense wife Margaret (Jane Wyatt) and their children Betty, Bud and Kathy.

*Here's Lucy* (1968–1974) Lucille Ball stars as Lucy Carter, a widow with two teen children (played by her real children Lucie Arnaz and Desi Arnaz Jr.), who takes a job as a secretary for her stuffy brother-in-law played by Gale Gordon.

*The Mothers-In-Law* (1967–1969) Emmy Award-Winning actress Eve Arden stars as Eve Hubbard, the sophisticated wife of straight-laced lawyer Herbert. Comedienne Kaye Ballard plays Kaye Buell, the outspoken wife of bombastic television writer Roger. The show centers on the laugh-filled misadventures of longtime neighbors who become related when their children Jerry and Suzie, suddenly get married.
