April 3: *Glass Onion: A Knives Out Mystery* (2022) The standalone sequel to *Knives Out* (2019), it stars Daniel Craig as the world-famous detective Benoit Blanc, and Edward Norton as tech billionaire Miles Bron. The ensemble cast also includes Janelle Monáe, Kathryn Hahn, Leslie Odom Jr., Jessica Henwick, Madelyn Cline, Kate Hudson, and Dave Bautista. Bron invites his friends for a getaway on his private Greek island. When someone turns up dead, Detective Blanc is put on the case. Rated PG-13: 2 hours 19 minutes

April 10: AWPL Classic Monday - *Sudden Fear* (1952) A rediscovered masterpiece of film noir stars Joan Crawford, Jack Palance and Gloria Grahame. Myra Hudson (Crawford) - a successful playwright - marries Lester Blaine (Palance) a mediocre actor. Myra soon discovers that Lester not only married her for money but that he plans to murder her with the help of his lover Irene Neves (Grahame) – so Myra concocts a scheme of her own! Not Rated: 1 hour 50 minutes.

April 17: *The Mortal Storm* (1940) Stars Frank Morgan, Margaret Sullavan, James Stewart and Robert. Young Professor Victor Roth (Morgan) enjoys a tranquil life with his family in Germany. His daughter Freya (Sullavan) is courted both by Martin (Stewart) and Fritz (Young). However, when the Nazis take control of the country, all their lives are shaken. Martin must flee to Austria because of his political stance. Victor loses his job and is sent to a concentration camp when he speaks out against Hitler. Meanwhile, Fritz joins the Nazis and is obliged to hunt down Freya. Not Rated: 1 hour 40 minutes.

April 24: In Honor of Earth Day: *My Octopus Teacher* (2020) Oscar-winning documentary stars South African naturalist and co-founder of the Sea Change Project, Craig Foster. After years of swimming every day in the freezing ocean at the tip of Africa, Foster meets an unlikely teacher a young octopus who displays remarkable curiosity. Visiting her den and tracking her movements for months on end he eventually wins the animal's trust and they develop a never before seen bond between human and wild animal. Not Rated: 1 hour 25 minutes.

May 1: *Mrs. Harris Goes to Paris* (2022) Historical comedy-drama based on Paul Gallico's 1958 novel *Mrs. 'Arris Goes to Paris* stars Lesley Manville, Isabelle Huppert, Lambert Wilson, Alba Baptista, Lucas Bravo, Ellen Thomas, Rose Williams, and Jason Isaacs; a widowed cleaning lady in 1950's London who falls madly in love with a couture Dior dress and decides that she must have one of her own. After she works, starves, and gambles to raise the funds to pursue her dream, she embarks on an adventure to Paris which will change not only her own outlook, but the very future of the House of Dior. Rated PG: 1 hour 55 minutes

May 8: AWPL Classic Monday - *North by Northwest* (1959) Alfred Hitchcock's spy thriller stars Cary Grant, Eva Marie Saint and James Mason. The screenplay was by Ernest Lehman, who wanted to write "the Hitchcock picture to end all Hitchcock pictures" – and it certainly delivers! Grant stars as Roger Thornhill, a Madison Avenue advertising executive who is mistaken for someone else and kidnapped by a group of international spies, headed by Mason. Hitchcock's film was very influential on the James Bond movies and subsequent action-thriller films. Not Rated: 2 hours 16 minutes

May 15: In Honor of Asian/Pacific American Heritage Month: *The Joy Luck Club* (1993) Wayne Wang's adaptation of Amy Tan's 1989 bestselling novel: in San Francisco, a group of aging Chinese women ("The Joy Luck Club") meet regularly to trade familial stories while playing Mahjong. In a series of sixteen vignettes that spans generations and continents, the film explores cultural conflict and the often-turbulent relationships between four first-generation Chinese-American women and their respective mothers born in feudal China. Rated R: 2 hours 19 minutes.

May 22: *The Starling* (2021) Stars Melissa McCarthy, Chris O'Dowd and Kevin Kline. Lilly and Jack Maynard, a married couple, suffers a tragic hardship, leading Jack (O'Dowd) to head off to deal with his grief while Lilly (McCarthy) remains in the "real" world, dealing with her own guilt. As if Lilly's troubles weren't bad enough, a starling that has nested in her backyard begins to harass and attack her and she becomes comically obsessed with killing it. Lilly eventually finds guidance from Dr. Larry Fine (Kline), a quirky psychologist-turned-veterinarian with a troubled past of his own. The two form a unique and unlikely friendship as they each help the other to explore, acknowledge and confront their problems. Rated PG-13: 1 hour 42 minutes.

June 5: *The Banshees of Inisherin* (2022) – Martin McDonagh's black tragicomedy set on a remote island off the west coast of Ireland, stars Colin Farrell and Brendan Gleeson; lifelong friends Padraic (Farrell) and Colm (Gleeson), who find themselves at an impasse when Colm unexpectedly puts an end to their friendship. A stunned Padraic, aided by his sister Siobhan (Kerry Condon) and troubled young islander Dominic (Barry Keoghan), endeavours to repair the relationship, refusing to take no for an answer. But Padraic's repeated efforts only strengthen his former friend's resolve and when Colm delivers a desperate ultimatum, events swiftly escalate, with shocking consequences. Rate R: 1 hour 54 minutes.

June 12: AWPL Classic Monday - *Sunset Blvd.* (1950) Billy Wilder's brilliant black comedy stars William Holden, Gloria Swanson and Erich von Stroheim. Joe Gillis (Holden), a struggling screenwriter (turned gigolo), befriends Norma Desmond (Swanson), a former silent-film star (turned sugar mama); Desmond gradually draws him into her demented fantasy world, where she dreams of making a triumphant return to the silver screen. *Mr. DeMille, I'm ready for my close-up.* Not Rated: 1 hour 50 minutes.

June 19: In Honor of Juneteenth: *Till* (2022) Chinonye Chukwu's powerful drama stars Danielle Deadwyler: the true story of Mamie Till Mobley's relentless pursuit of justice for her 14 year old son, Emmett Till, who, in 1955, was lynched while visiting his cousins in Mississippi. In Mamie's poignant journey of grief turned to action, we see the universal power of a mother's ability to change the world. Rated PG-13: 2 hours 10 minutes.

June 26: *Ticket to Paradise* (2022) Romantic comedy stars George Clooney and Julia Roberts. David and Georgia, two divorced parents who can't stand each other, head to Bali after their daughter, Lily, announces her plans to marry a local islander she just met while on holiday. They decide to put aside their differences and work together to stop the wedding, believing that doing so will keep Lily from making a dreadful mistake similar to their own. Rated PG-13: 1 hour 44 minutes.
