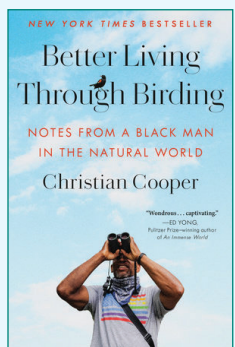

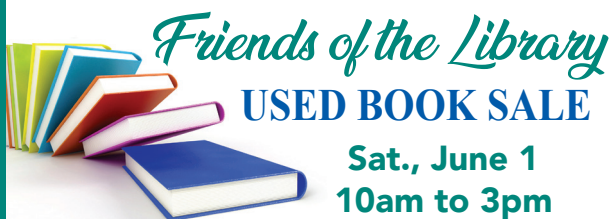

The Unique Ecology and Inhabitants of Warwick's Gibraltar Rock Forest
