Migration: It's Not Just for Birds

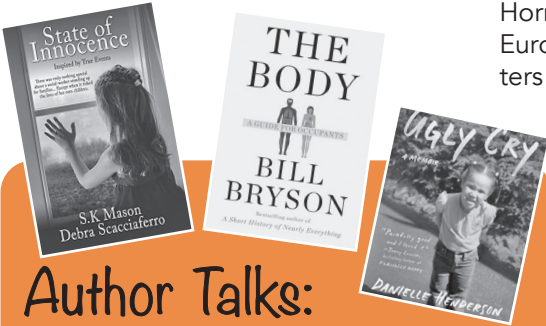
(Virtual Presentation)

Storytelling & Performance

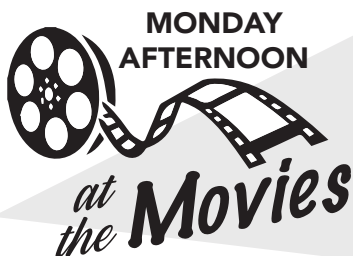
Tues. Oct. 26, Nov. 2 & 9 at 5:30
