







The murder of adoption consultant Danielle Roberts in an upscale Austin neighborhood upends the Pollitt family, who feel grief, relief, and suspicion.




Deadlock


Half Moon Bay

Deputy Coroner Clay Edison is confounded by the discovery of a decades-old child's skeleton in a torn-up park and a local businessman's claim that it could be his sister.




The Shadows

A copycat killing of a teenager 25 years after the original murder reopens old wounds in a small British town.




When She Was Good






A Private Cathedral

Detective Isaac Bell's investigation into an attempted assassination brings him to the construction site of the Panama Canal—and straight into a nest of vipers




The Lions of Fifth Avenue


Squeeze Me


Royal


Choppy Water


The Evening and the Morning

CIA agent Alisha Flynn is willing to go rogue if it means catching the most heartless band of criminals she's ever encountered.






