**January 3—*The Father* (2020)** Starring Olivia Colman and Anthony Hopkins. A man refuses all assistance from his daughter as he ages. As he tries to make sense of his changing circumstances, he begins to doubt his loved ones, his own mind and even the fabric of his reality. PG-13; 1 hour, 37 min.

**January 10—*Miracles From Heaven* (2016)** Starring Jennifer Garner and Kylie Rogers. . When Christy discovers her 10-year-old daughter Anna has a rare, incurable disease, she becomes a ferocious advocate for her daughter's healing as she searches for a solution. After Anna has a freak accident, an extraordinary miracle unfolds in the wake of her dramatic rescue that leaves medical specialists mystified, her family restored, and their community inspired. Rated PG; 1 hour, 49 min.

**January 24—*Cry Macho* (2021)** Starring Clint Eastwood and Dwight Yoakam. A one-time rodeo star and washed-up horse breeder takes a job to bring a man's young son home and away from his alcoholic mom. On their journey, the horseman finds redemption through teaching the boy what it means to be a good man. Rated PG-13; 1 hour, 44 min.

**January 31—*The Emu Runner* (2018)** Starring Rhae-Kye Waites and Wayne Blair. Emu Runner is a lyrical story about the impact a mother's death has on an Aboriginal family living in an isolated community, which is perched on an ancient river and surrounded by sprawling plains. The story is seen through the eyes of Gem, a spirited 8-year-old girl, who deals with the grief of her mother's death by forging a bond with a wild emu, a mythical bird of her ancestors. This spiritual dreaming is a bond she will do anything to keep, but one that puts her at odds with the new social worker. Rated NR; 1 hour, 35 min.

**February 7—*Respect* (2021)** Starring Jennifer Hudson and Forest Whitaker. Following the rise of Aretha Franklin's career from a child singing in her father's church's choir to her international superstardom, RESPECT is the remarkable true story of the music icon's journey to find her voice. Rated PG-13; 2 hours, 15 min.

**February 14—*The Great Debaters* (2013)** Starring Denzel Washington and Forest Whitaker. A drama based on the true story of Melvin B. Tolson, a professor at historically black Wiley College in Texas. In 1935, he inspired students to form the school's first debate team, which went on to challenge Harvard in the national championship.

**February 28—*Charming the Hearts of Men*** (2021) Starring Anna Friel and Kelsey Grammer. A romantic drama set during the politically charged early 60s where a sophisticated woman returns to her Southern home town and discovers her options are limited yet discrimination is plentiful. With the help of a Congressional ally, she inspires historic legislation which allows opportunities and protections never before afforded to women.

**March 7—*Radium Girls*** (2020) Starring Joey King and Abby Quinn. Based on true events, sisters Bessie and Jo Cavallo paint dial watches at the American Radium factory in New Jersey. When Jo's health starts to decline, Bessie starts to question if Radium is safe and discovers a veil of corporate lies. NR; 1 hour, 43 min.

**March 14—*Belfast*** (2021) Starring Jamie Dornan and Caitriona Balfe. At the dawn of the Troubles in Northern Ireland, a young boy sees the effects of conflict all around him. His father finds an opportunity to create a more exciting station in life, but his mother is terrified of leaving everything she knows. If the family goes to England, she worries that they will lose their identity, or find themselves covering it up in some way. Everywhere they go, it seems as if people are in upheaval and waiting for the next shoe to drop. In Belfast, anything can happen in an instant. Rated PG-13; 1 hour, 38 min.

**March 21—*Il Postino*** (1995) Starring Massimo Troisi, Philippe Noiret, Maria Grazia Cucinotta Mario is a bumbling mailman who's madly in love with the most beautiful woman in town ... and who's too shy to tell her how he feels. But when a world-famous poet -- Pablo Neruda -- moves into town, Mario is inspired. With Neruda's help, he finds the right words to win the woman's heart! This unforgettably funny comedy proves that passion—with some artful deception—can win the most improbable love! Rated PG; 1 hour, 48 min.

**March 28—*Spencer*** (2021) Starring Kristen Stewart. It is 1992 and Diana finds herself lost as she tries to drive to the Sandringham Estate to celebrate the holidays with the Royal Family. The cold treatment she receives upon her arrival is only exacerbated by her knowledge of her husband's affair and her acute awareness of the cage she is trapped in. The only bright spot of the supposed holiday is spending time with her sons, William and Harry. As the princess powers through three days of madness, she realizes what her next step should be. Rated R; 111 min.
